

Budget Allocation FY'14





Justification of increased line items

- Textbook account: \$88,769 is needed to purchase materials with our current math and reading program K-2 and to purchase new material for grades 3-5 in ELA.
- Principal Supplies: Additional is needed due to increased Riso and Copier supplies needed for additional staff.
- Computer Supplies: New computers are needed to replace older models, which continue to break down. Additional ink for printers is needed with increased staff.
- Upgrade/Software License: Additional \$1,200 is needed for current software licenses, such as Study Island and Sumdog
- Other (Server/Network): Additional \$1,000 is to purchase 6 of 12 switches and purchase and install 8 of 30 wireless access points

Justification of increased line items

- Custodial Supplies: Additional \$2,500 is needed due to 119 additional students, as well as to cover a deficit in this account
- Building Maintenance: Additional \$18,000 is needed for the following repairs: masonry repairs to cracks in walls, front stairs, adding two additional drains to the building on the side, replacing two front rotted columns, and adding duct work in Gym 2 to aid with air flow and heat.
- Copier/Riso: Additional \$2,240 is due to increase in maintenance contracts.
- Computer Maintenance (New Account)- This account allows us to purchase and install 11 of 30 wireless access points.

Justification for Increases

- **Textbook Account Increase:** Funds needed to purchase additional materials to for our core Reading and Mathematics programs for grades K-5
- Principal Supplies: Funding needed for replacement microphones, projector, inks, and to enhance security walkie-talkies and flashlights
- Computer Supplies: Classroom computers and Tech Lab computers use more ink as students are learn to create reports, presentations and print them as well as the thumb drives to save their work
- **Pencils/Paper:** More and more students are unable to bring their own pencils, notebooks, crayons or pens. This places a greater financial burden on the schools to ensure each child has equitable supplies for learning
- Equipment Contracted: Laminator has been broken for several months as the cost to repair is substantial
- **Decas Equipment/Repairs:** Repair and move of secretarial workstation and telephone to the entrance of the building
- **Technology Accounts:** New Internet service, upgrades of server, software




