Article 1:

To choose by ballot a moderator to preside at said meeting.

To see if the District will vote to act on the reports of the Water Commissioners, Board of Engineers, Prudential Committee and all other officers and committees and accept the same as printed in the Annual Report of the fiscal year ended June 30, 2012, and that any and all reports be accepted as submitted at this meeting.

Article 3:

To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds the sum of \$73,280.51 which represents 1.5% of the Wareham Fire District's Fiscal 2013 tax levy for Clerical and Administrative expenses, of which \$2,731.00 is for the Board of Assessors and Collector expenses for the Town of Wareham, or to act anything thereon or thereunto.

This is an annual request.

Article 4:

To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds the sum of \$506,279.00 to pay Plymouth County Retirement Association the assessment for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, or to act anything thereon or thereunto.

Article 5:

This article is the annual provision to fund the Reserve Fund, which fund is for the purpose of extraordinary and unforeseen expenses in accordance with MGL, Chapter 40, Section 5C.

These funds would be available at the discretion of the Prudential Committee to authorize the utilization of these funds when contract(s) are ratified, negotiations are settled, and contractual obligations are mandated during the course of a Fiscal Year, rather than extending the process into the next Spring District Meeting.

Article 8:

To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds the sum of \$49,000.00 to purchase a replacement vehicle, and related accessories assigned to the Master Mechanic, or to act anything thereon or thereunto.

This 2001, Chevrolet 3500, 4 x 4 service truck is currently assigned to the District Mechanic. This 12-year old truck has 109,811 miles (as of 03/18/13, at 2:50 p.m.)

The service body is severely rotted and beyond repair. The floor of the bed has rotted through. Structural supports and cross members are rotted and missing. The right, front tool compartment is leaking water from the wheel housing. The exhaust manifold bolts have rotted off. An entire muffler system is needed.

During the daily routine, this unit enables the Mechanic to pick up parts, travel to/from schooling/training, and drive to outlying stations to make repairs on apparatus. The

Mechanic is required to respond to all structure and brush fires, if on duty, to assist in case a truck is in need of repairs in the field.

This truck has a trailer hitch, which offers another optional tow vehicle to tow one of the many necessary trailers the Wareham Fire Department and Water Department is required to operate efficiently.

We project the longevity of this type of vehicle to last approximately 10 years. Replacement was due in FY2011. In order to meet our Capital Plan, we have extended the replacement to FY 2014.

It is suggested to figure approximately 5% price increase each year, thereafter, on the purchase price.

Total cost of project is estimated at \$36,000, including lights, radios, lettering, and labor.

This 1997, Ford Crown Victoria, support vehicle was rendered out-of-service due to excessive rot on the frame, brake lines, and the tires. The frame is rotted through in the area of that secures the suspension. The brake lines are completely rotted. The rocker panels are rotted through under both rear doors.

We project the longevity of this type of vehicle to last approximately 15 years. Replacement was due in FY2007. In order to meet our Capital Plan, we have extended the replacement to FY 2014.

It is suggested to figure approximately 5% price increase each year, thereafter, on the purchase price.

This article will replace the previously rescinded article. This article will fund the purchase of approximately 70 acres of undeveloped land. Approval of this amended map will greatly benefit the District. First, this land will provide an important buffer to protect the aquifer supplying the District's Maple Park and Maple Springs Well sites. In addition to the benefit of conserving high quality open space, the District, by obtaining a separate fee interest in sub-dividing this parcel will preserve its right for future expansion of the Maple Park Well site to accommodate additional sources of supply. Finally, as this land abuts properties already owned by the District this article represents a unique opportunity to expand District owned land.

The Maple Springs Wells groundwater has tested positive for bacteria, and increasing levels of iron and manganese. These funds will be used to permit, design and install the equipment necessary at the existing facilities for Phase I of a two-phased treatment plan for the treatment of iron and manganese, and comply with DEP requirements to return Well #1 to service. These improvements will be incorporated into a future treatment plant which will be constructed to treat groundwater from both the Maple Park and Maple Springs Well Sites.
